EDUCATE A CHILD BURSARY FUND

"The foundation of every country is the education of its youth".



Most of the families or guardians of the learners that RCV supports, face challenges in paying tuition fees. To ensure that tuition is affordable for our beneficiaries, we have created the Educate-A-Child Bursary Fund. With the funds received from donors, we are able to subsidise tuition fees and transport.

To become involved, a corporate can sponsor a class for R2 400 per month, while an individual can subsidise a learner for as little as R100 per month. When you subsidise a learner's education, you receive their photo, academic results, as well as regular newsletters. By becoming involved with this Bursary Fund, you can help us to improve the education and training of disempowered youth in South Africa, contributing to the larger objective of uplifting the country's economy and the wellbeing of those marginalised in our society.



Over 40% of SA children have inadequate parental care, little social stability or access to appropriate education. With a 91.7% attendance rate at educational institutions amongst 5 –17 year-olds, the issue is not access to education, but access to appropriate and quality education. Children with learning difficulties, due to a range of social factors will be marginalised by the current system and will probably not graduate. These children could become a burden on our society without our help!

Rainbow Children's Village is a place of safety for abused and abandoned children. All our children come from backgrounds where education has not been a factor in their lives. We have partnered with Sparrow Schools to prepare our youth with learning difficulties to become self-sufficient, responsible adults through appropriate comprehensive education, vocational skills training, learner and psychosocial support initiatives.



What is offered at Sparrow Schools?

Sparrow Foundation School – learners aged 7 to 14 follow a specialised curriculum aimed at overcoming their learning difficulties. This includes language, numeracy, life orientation, computer literacy, media and music, as well as an introduction to practical skills such as cookery, woodwork, creative design & technology and music & movement. Extensive learner support (remedial therapy) is also provided.

Sparrow Combined Technical Skills School – learners aged 14 to 18 are exposed to a learner-centred approach that prepares them for employment and further education. They offer a comprehensive education in English, Maths, Natural Science, and Personal and Social well-being, as well as intensive skills-based training in Hospitality and Wholesale and Retail. Their innovative lessons and supportive curriculum enhance learners' ability to engage with the curriculum, equipping them with practical skills and a well-rounded understanding of their chosen field. In the Hospitality or Wholesale and Retail classes, learner spend 75% of their time doing practical work and getting a real-life understanding of what it means to pursue a career within that industry. The other 25% of their time is spent in the classroom learning the theory behind the practical.
